**SUBJ: STATE POLICE TO ANNOUNCE ENFORCEMENT EFFORT  
ON I-81 STRETCH IN CUMBERLAND, DAUPHIN COUNTIES**

**State Police Acting Commissioner Frank E. Pawlowski will announce a program to reduce crashes involving trucks along a busy section of Interstate 81 in Cumberland and Dauphin counties during a news conference Monday, Sept. 29, at 10:30 a.m. at State Police Headquarters, 1800 Elmerton Ave., Harrisburg.**

**The federally funded Ticket Aggressive Cars and Trucks (TACT) initiative will focus on the 33-mile stretch of I-81 from the Newville Exit in Cumberland County to the intersection with Interstate 83 in Dauphin County. In addition to an aggressive patrol effort, highway billboards and safety awareness messages will be part of the initiative.**

**Joining Pawlowski for the announcement will be Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration Administrator John Hill; James Runk, president and CEO of the Pennsylvania Motor Truck Association; and Scott Christie, Pennsylvania Department of Transportation District 8 executive.**
